Ordinance No. 4

An Ordinance to better secure the peace and quiet of the Town of Tontitown Arkansas.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas:

- It is hereby made unlawful for any person, either by day or by night to disturb the peace and quiet of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown, or any neighborhood or family within said Incorporated limits, by loud and unusual noise, or by violent, profane or obscene language, whether addressed to the party disturbed or not, or threatening to fight, or challenging others to fight, or by discharging fire arms or by casting or throwing stones, bricks, or other mineral, metalic, wooden, or vegetable substance at any person or any building with intent to inflict an injury upon the person, or disturb the peace and quiet of any individual or family; or by riding or driving any horse or horses at an unusual speed along any of the streets, alleys, or other public highways within the Corporate limits of said Town.
- II Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).
- III Any drunken person found at large in the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas, shall be arrested and taken before the Magistrate of said Town.
- IV Upon a drunken person being brought before the Magistrate, he shall be confined into a jail or delivered into custody to some discreet person.
- Any person who shall have been arrested and convicted for drunkardness more than once, shall be considered as a habitual drunkard, and as such if arrested and convicted he shall be fined for each offense not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).
- VI It will be considered as a misdemeanor for any person to annoy or threaten or terrify any one in the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas, for the purpose of getting or proccuring native wine.
- VII Any person sending any minor in an errand for the purpose of proccuring wine, or any minor qualifying himself of age for the purpose above stated shall be deemed quilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00).
- VIII This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.
