

Ordinance No. 5

An Ordinance to punish resistance and obstruction of the enforcements of the Penal Ordinances of the Town of Tontitown Arkansas.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas;

- I It is hereby declared unlawful for any person or persons to willfully and knowingly to resist, obstruct or attempt to resist or obstruct within the Incorporated limits of Tontitown Arkansas, any Sheriff, or any deputy Sheriff, Constable or Marshall or other Ministerial Officers in the service of any process or execution or any attempt to serve or execute any summons, writ or warrant, or other process in any case, civil or criminal, that may have been issued by any Tribunal Board, Judge, Court, Justice of the Peace, or Mayor, at any time, or other Officer authorized by law to issue process.
- II Any person violating the provisions of Section I of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), and may also be imprisoned not exceeding Six months.
- III Be it further ordained that it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person or persons within the Corporated limits of Tontitown Arkansas, by force to set at liberty, or rescue any person held in custody by any of the Officers enumerated in Section I of this Ordinance, or in any prison or place of confinement for any offense other than felony either before or after conviction.
- IV Any person violating any provisions of Section III of this Ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine in any sum not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00), and may also be imprisoned not exceeding Six months.
- V All Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
