

Ordinance No. 17

An Ordinance providing for the Election of a Town Marshall and prescribing his duties.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas;

- I The Marshall of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas shall be elected by the Town Council and shall hold his office during the pleasure of the Council electing him.
- II He shall within ten (10) days after his election, take an oath of office similar to the oath of a constable, and enter into a bond with good security to the Mayor and Aldermen in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200), to be approved by the Council and conditioned for the faithful performance of his duties and the correct and timely accounting for all public fines that may come into his hands by reason of said office.
- III In addition to such duties as are made incumbent on him by Ordinances of the Town and by the Statutes of the State it shall be his duty either in person or by deputy to attend upon all meetings of the Council and keep the Council Room, supplied at the public expense, unless otherwise supplied, with necessary fuel and lights and see that the Council Room is kept in proper condition and comfortable for the Council sittings.
- IV That he shall obey without delay all orders of the Council to him directed and shall go upon the streets at a reasonable hour in the morning and remain on duty till after usual business hours at night; apprehend all persons, without process, offending against any of the penal ordinances of the Town in his presence or view and carry the offenders without unnecessary delay before the Mayor and prefer charges against them, that they may be dealt with according to law.
- V That he shall keep the streets and sidewalks, and other public grounds free from obstructions by having the same removed.
- VI That he shall not permit persons unnecessarily to assemble on the sidewalks in such numbers as to obstruct the same.
- VII That he shall when ordered by the Council abate or remove any nuisance or other thing offensive or dangerous to the inhabitants of the Town provided it shall be his duty without orders to remove or cause to be removed at the public expense unless otherwise provided, without the Corporate limits of the Town, the carcass of any animal found dead within the said Corporate limits, and any failure or refusal of the Marshall to discharge any of the duties required by this or any other Ordinance of the Town shall be sufficient cause for his removal.
- VIII That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
