Ordinance No. 20

An Ordinance to better secure the peace and quiet of the Town of Tontitown Arkansas.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas;

- I That if any person shall willfully or maliciously disturb, either by day or night, the peace and quiet of the Town of Tontitown, of any person, neighborhood or family within the Corporate limits of said Town, by loud or unusual noise, or by violent, abusive, obscene or profane language, whether addressed to the persons so disturbed, or some other person, or by threatening to fight, fighting, quarreling, challenging to fight, shooting off any firearms or brandishing the same, or by riding any horse or driving any horse at an unusual rate of speed along any streets, alleys or highways in said Town of Tontitown, or by alarming falsely any person or persons by cries that cause such person or persons to believe that same is in great danger of losing life or receiving an injury, or by throwing or casting any stone, brick, or any other substance whatever at any building with the intent to inflict any injury, or disturb the peace and quiet of any individual or any family within the Corporate limits of Tontitown Arkansas shall be deemed quilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300).
- II That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
