Ordinance No. 21

An Ordinance relating to persons appearing at public places in a drunken or intoxicated condition.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas;

- I Any person who shall appear at any picnic, barbacue, children's day service, Sunday School celebration, Church service,
 literary society, singing school, or any other public gathering or in any public place within the Town of Tontitown, in a
 drunken or intoxicated condition shall be deemed quilty of a
 misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in
 any sum not less than Ten Dollars nor more than Twenty-Five
 Dollars.
- II That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
