

Ordinance No. 26

An Ordinance of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown to provide for the opening or grading of all the avenues, streets, alleys, highways as shown on the plat of said Town at the Recorder Office of Washington County Arkansas, book 100, page 467 and also plat book ___ page 75 also to provide for the opening of a new street in the Corporated limits of Tontitown named above.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas;

- I That all avenues, streets, alleys, highways within the Corporate limits of said Town of Tontitown Arkansas be and same are hereby declared public avenues, streets, alleys, highways subject to regulations & repairs under the orders of the Town Council and Ordinance of said Town.
- II That the road commencing at the Barrington road at the end of Felix Ardemagni & John Wasson porperty running west to the intersection of the Elm Springs road at the corner of Joe Bariola & C.H. Welch property be opened at the regular width required by law for all public roads.
- III That the aforesaid road shall be known hereon as Liberty Street, provided that the land owner of the lands confining to the said street shall do all the grading and bridge in and all others work neccessary to put the street in condition to be acceptable by the Street Commissioner of the aforesaid Town.
- IV Be if further ordained that it shall be herein after unlawful for any person or persons, or proprietors, or agents within the Corporated limits of said Town to willfully and knowingly obstruct or fill in ditches to prevent the unusal free current of water, in order to have a better driveway that may obstruct the free course of traffic, and any such action done on any of this public avenues, streets, alleys, highways shall be deemed a misdemenor and upon conviction thereof of any sections of this Ordinance shall constitute a separated offense and shall be fined by Mayor in any sum not less than Five Dollars nor more than Fifty Dollars.
- V This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
