

Ordinance No. 30

An Ordinance for the protection of ornamental and shade trees and defining certain trespassings and making same a misdemeanor.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas;

- I That on and after the passage of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to cut down, destroy or in any way or manner injure any growing ornamental or shade tree within the Corporate limits of the Town of Tontitown Arkansas.
- II That hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person to throw or cast stones, bricks or any other substance whatever at any private or public building, whether it be vacant or occupied in the Corporate limits of the said Town of Tontitown Arkansas.
- III It shall also be unlawful for any person to enter any vacant building for any purpose whatsoever, to drive any vehicle or motor vehicle in any vacant enclosed lot, yard, grove or ground used as a park, whether it be private or public without first having obtained the consent or permission of the owner, agent or tenant, to destroy or misuse fences of any kind of device used to inclose property within the Incorporated Town of Tontitown Arkansas.
- IV Any person or persons violating any of the foregoing provisions of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.
- V Any person or persons violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum of not less than One Dollar nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars at the discretion of the court.
- VI That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to conform with the present.
- VII That this Ordinance be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, the good and welfare of the Town requiring same.
