

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE TIME FOR THE FILING OF REFERENDUM PETITIONS PROVIDED FOR BY AMENDMENT NO. 7 TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable that in order to know definitely when a municipal measure is final, a period be fixed limiting the time within which a petition may be filed to refer a resolution or ordinance of the Town Council; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Tontitown

SECTION 1. On and after the date of the passage of this ordinance, any petition to secure a referendum election on a resolution or ordinance passed by the Town Council of the Town of Tontitown must, in order to be effective, be filed within thirty (30) days after the passage of such measure.

SECTION 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. The Town Council hereby ascertains and declares that because of the imperative need for a definite time limit beyond which municipal resolutions and ordinances cannot be attacked, and because of the fact that measures are pending which affect the health and safety of the inhabitants of the Town, an emergency exists; and this ordinance, being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, shall take effect and be in force immediately on and after its passage.
