

ORDINANCE NO. 62

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE TOWN OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS CONTRARY TO THE ORDINANCES OF SAID TOWN AND ADOPTING THE MOTOR VEHICLE CODE OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS IN ITS ENTIRETY AS ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS:

Section I

That Title 75 of the Official Edition of the Arkansas Statutes 1947 Annotated, Chapters 1-23 both inclusive, in so far as each is within the jurisdiction of the Mayors Court of the Town of Tontitown, Arkansas and as enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas and presently enforced as amended, is hereby adopted in its entirety as the law controlling motor vehicles and motor vehicle violations committed within the corporate limits of the Town of Tontitown, Arkansas.

Section II

WHEREAS, it is imperative for the safety of pedestrians and all other users of the highways, streets, roadways, and alleys of the Town of Tontitown, Arkansas to maintain strict enforcement of all the traffic and criminal laws designated to protect the public, and

WHEREAS, the penalties provided for in the aforesaid Title 75 of the Statutes of Arkansas Official Edition (1947) Annotated, are adopted as the penalties for violation of ordinances of the Town of Tontitown, Arkansas, and

Section III

WHEREAS, at the present time the ordinances of the said town are not adequate to provide such protection and to provide deterrent and punishment of violators within the town, the town council finds it necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and hereby declares that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance shall be in full force and from and after its passage and approval.
