

ORDINANCE NO. 63

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE " ARKANSAS CRIMINAL CODE " THE SAME BEING ACTS 1975, NO. 280, IN ITS ENTIRETY AS ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS PROHIBITING THE VIOLATION OF ANY MATTER THEREIN WHICH IS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE MAYORS COURT OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS AS PROVIDED IN THE AFORESAID CRIMINAL CODE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS:

Section I

That Acts 1975, NO. 280, known as the " Arkansas Criminal Code " as enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas and presently enforced as may be amended is hereby adopted in its entirety as the law controlling the violation of the criminal laws and providing penalties for violations committed within the corporate limits of the Town of Tontitown, Arkansas.

Section II

WHEREAS, it is imperative for the safety of persons and property and all inhabitants of the said Town of Tontitown, Arkansas and to maintain strict protection and enforcement of all the criminal laws designed to protect the public generally, and

WHEREAS, the penalty provided in the aforesaid Act 280 of the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas are adopted as the penalties for violations of ordinances of the Town of Tontitown, Arkansas, and

Section III

WHEREAS, at the present time the ordinances of said town are not adequate to provide such protection and punishment of violators within the town, the town council finds that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and protection of property of the citizens and inhabitants thereof and hereby declares that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance shall be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
