

RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING MAY 3-9, 2004 AS
NATIONAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION WEEK

RESOLUTION NUMBER 111

WHEREAS, historic preservation is an effective tool for managing growth, revitalizing neighborhoods, foster local pride and maintaining community character while enhancing livability; and

WHEREAS, historic preservation is relevant for communities across the nation, both urban and rural, and for Americans of all ages, all walks of life and all ethnic backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, it is important to celebrate the role of history in our lives and the contributions made by dedicated individuals in helping to preserve the tangible aspects of the heritage that has shaped us as a people; and


WHEREAS, "New Frontiers in Preservation" is the theme for National Historic Preservation Week 2004, cosponsored by the City of Tontitown, the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program, the Department of Arkansas Heritage and the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mayor Daniel R. Watson, do proclaim May 3 through 9, 2004, as National Historic Preservation Week, and call upon the people of Tontitown to join their fellow citizens across the United States in recognizing and participating in this special observance.
