## ordinance no. <u>200**8**</u>– 1- 303

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 2005-3-209, ADOPTED MARCH 15, 2005, AND SECTION 30.04 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR THE CITY OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, Ordinance Number 2005-3-209, codified at Section 30.04 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Tontitown, Arkansas, describes the duties of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, it is determined that it is the best interest of the City of Tontitown, Arkansas to amend the Ordinance to provide for more effective and appropriate management of the City;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TONTITOWN, ARKANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Section 1, subparagraphs (k) and (l) of Ordinance 2005-3-209, adopted March 15, 2005, as well as Section 30.04, subparagraphs (K) and (L) of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Tontitown, Arkansas, are hereby amended to read as follows:

- (k) Determine the day-to-day activities and supervise the city department heads, appointive officers, and those city employees not working under the direct supervision of a department head. Any city employee who works under the direct supervision of a department head of the city shall be supervised and directed by the department head who supervises the employee;
- (l) Have the power to appoint and remove all department heads and those city employees not working under the direct supervision of a department head, subject to the city council's vote to override. Any city employee who works under the direct supervision of a department head of the city shall be appointed and removed by the department head who supervises the employee, subject to the city council's vote to override.

Section 2: All other provisions of Ordinance Number 2005-3-209, codified at Section

30.04 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Tontitown, Arkansas, shall remain unchanged, except as specifically amended herein.

Section 3: EMERGENCY CLAUSE. The City Council of the City of Tontitown, Arkansas, has determined that the orderly operation of city departments, including the appointing, directing, supervising and removal of city employees is vital to the public peace, health, safety and welfare. As currently drafted, city ordinances are insufficient to ensure orderly operation of city departments, and that it is necessary to immediately amend the ordinance provided herein to add stability and certainty to the operation of city government. Thus, the City Council hereby declares an emergency to exist and this ordinance, being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
