7. Comments from Citizens
Rocky Clinton said he had a bad experience last week that made him angry while trying to go to his 8:00 AM physical therapy treatment at the Ozark Outlet Mall. Mr. Clinton took Highway 412 to Barrington and ended up setting at that intersection eight times, the traffic was backup about two miles and when he got to Highway 112 there was no traffic. We always think about Highway 112 as being the bottleneck, but it was Barrington that was the bottleneck. It took Mr. Clinton 40 minutes to get from his house to the Ozark Outlet Mall. So, when this is issue is brought up to the city they say "It's ARDOT" and we can't do anything about it". Mr. Clinton has since taken another route that takes about 15 minutes. Now, in 2017 our Planning Board spent hours every week along with the former mayor and James Clark and staff for a period of a year and a half to come up with a zoning map for a Master Street Plan. Mr. Clinton came to City Hall and asked to see the Master Street Plan,

and nobody could find it. So, it's not being used but after some time James Clark pulled it up on the computer and Mr. Clinton believes the fault falls upon the council. The Planning Board proposed two main arteries in this city to relieve traffic from 412, one on Liberty from 112 to old 68 and one that is Kissinger from 112 to Harmon Rd. And nothing has been done in five years now we are required by the state again to come up with a new revised Master Street Plan, and workshops are about to start. Nothing that we proposed, nothing that this body ratified has been done and Mr. Clinton thinks it's time for the council to do their elected duty and do what it takes to relieve the traffic off 412 and see our city function better and if other cities can do it so can we.

Kenneth Lovett said he heard a little bit of Rocky's speech and he's pointing finger at the council, but the committee has their responsibilities too, but we do need some roads and Mr. Lovett thinks we need to revisit the Master Plan because east and west will help but we need some north and south to.

Also, we need to get some equipment to do air sampling, the cost of the manual type with several different tubes to test is \$1,300.00 or we can hire a company.

And the third thing is in reference to the code of conduct posted on the wall and the way we treat each other. Also, Mr. Lovett doesn't see the Planning Commission and the council communicating with each other, for example last week there was a parking lot expansion discussion at the Planning Commission and then it was moved to the City Council Meeting for approval and there was a breakdown of communication for the request, so it was sent back to the Committee of the Whole for further discussion. Mr. Lovett asked if there is a document somewhere somebody can read or are they reading it.

Councilman Tim Burress explained the way the meeting is currently setup, the planning meeting and a week later is this meeting (city council) which is the only voting meeting we have a month, sure it is possible that we could all attend the planning commission meeting but it doesn't always work out that way, but even after that sometimes it's the first time that we hear, even if we're there and I think there probably could be a little more crystallization for us beforehand but we don't get our packets till Friday and sometimes there's just not enough time, so communication is everything and we could probably do a better job.

Chris Hunt said he is speaking second hand but still just as an FYI he wanted to make the council aware of a situation located downhill from the new development going in on Mantegani. The resident at 625 Javello has been overwhelmed with runoff water from the 20 acres that was cleared of forest to make room for homes. Mr. Hunt doesn't know what the subdivision plans entail for the runoff water, but he wanted to give the council a heads up that there are goats in a little ravine and they're getting flooded out. (James Clark the Public Works Director or Roger Duncan the City Inspector can be contacted).

Lisa Parks wanted to introduce herself, she has lived in Tontitown for about 17 years, and she is running for Arkansas State Senate District 31 which now covers Tontitown.
