#### **Public Works Department**

### STREETS/PARKS:

As of the date of this meeting, dirt work should be completed on North Ardemagni Road. This is a small project that has been years in the making. Interim Mayor McCartney signed the contract with Charles Ward to perform the dirt work on May 20<sup>th</sup>, finally setting this in motion. I will be advertising for bids on the asphalt paving within the next week. Hopefully, paving can be completed by the end of October. The estimated cost for the paving is \$80,000.

#### WATER/SEWER:

At this time, we have received the majority of the materials that we ordered for the water and sewer bond projects. As I have mentioned previously, the first project that we will construct will be the 18" water main line on the north side of 412 from North Mantegani, east to Highway 112. I have instructed our engineer to prepare the bid advertisement for this project as soon as possible. If you remember, we had three years from the time of the bond closing to complete the projects and dispense the funds. We are rapidly approaching the end of the first year, with no pipe in the ground so far. However, now that we have the materials, there should be no problem spending the funds. My fear is that we may not be able to complete all of the projects we planned with the amount of dollars that we have. I have been very conservative with reserve funds for the last few years in anticipation of major water and sewer improvements. Therefore, we have a fairly healthy reserve, which we will definitely have to tap into in the next two years.

On July 27<sup>th</sup>, I was able to attend meeting of the Joint Committee on City, County and Local Affairs at the State Capitol, along with approximately twenty-five of my colleagues in the water and wastewater industry. Our reason for attending this meeting was to urge officials to address the needs of the water and wastewater industry for the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. In the Fall of 2021, the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission (ANRC) solicited applications from cities and water and wastewater utilities for improvement projects to be funded by ARPA. To date, not one dollar has been committed to fund these needs. Although, hundreds of millions of dollars have been allocated to expanding and enhancing broadband in the state.

There are two major issues relating to the ARPA funds. The first issue, the funds must be spent by the end of calendar year 2026. That does not seem like a short timeline until you consider what is involved in getting a project "shovel ready." Engineers spoke to the committee regarding the time it takes to draft plans, get approval from the Arkansas Department of Health, acquire easements and receive materials, given the current supply chain issues. The second issue is the amount funds available vs. the needs. Currently, there is around \$550 million of the ARPA funds remaining and the total of funds applied for is over \$5 billion.

# Tontitown Historical Museum (THM) Report for the COW Meeting Tuesday, August 16, 2022

The THM Board of Directors met in-person on Monday, August 1, 2022.

- 1. The 123<sup>rd</sup> Tontitown Grape Festival: We had a successful event with our extended hours. We had several new visitors that have never been to the museum before, as well as our regular folks that visit while they are in town for the festival.
- 2. Visitors: We had 31 visitors in July.
- 3. Arkansas Humanities Council (AHC) Grant: Three language professors at the University of Arkansas -- Dr. Ryan Calabretta-Sajder (Italian), Dr. Kathleen Condray (German), and Dr. Linda Jones (French) -- received an AHC grant for a project entitled "Mapping Unheard Migrant Voices in Arkansas." This project will make Italian, German, and French history in Arkansas more accessible to the general public through Digital Humanities projects via the internet. During the Tontitown Grape Festival, THM worked with Dr. Calabretta-Sajder to video festival preparation and activities, and to interview Italian settler family members for the project. THM will continue to assist as needed. The project will be available to the public next year.
- 4. The Italian American Podcast, based in New York, is the first, totally engaging podcast dedicated to helping Italian Americans learn about and celebrate their brilliant heritage. We were fortunate to have John M. Viola, Rossela Rago, Patrick O'Boyle, and Joe Minnella of The Italian American Podcast spend two days at the 123rd Tontitown Grape Festival learning about Tontitown's Italian heritage, and then share it on their podcast and later YouTube channel. To say they were blown away with Tontitown is an understatement. The podcast, featuring THM Board member Heather Ranalli Peachee and former THM Junior Board member Kara Jo Engle, was released August 10. Take time to enjoy this fantastic story of Tontitown history!
