CITY OF TONTITOWN, WASHINGTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS

**A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE WILLINGNESS OF THE CITY OF TONTITOWN TO UTILIZE FEDERAL-AID SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM - ATTRIBUTABLE FUNDS ADMINISTERED BY THE NORTHWEST ARKANSAS REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION FOR A PROJECT TO CONSTRUCT A LEFT TURN LANE ON BARRINGTON ROAD AND FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO THE U.S. HIGHWAY 412 AND BARRINGTON ROAD INTERSECTION.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Tontitown understands Federal-aid Surface Transportation Block Grant Program Funds are available at 80% federal participation and 20% local match to begin the design and environmental work for a project to construct a left turn lane on Barrington Road and for improvements to the U.S. Highway 412 and Barrington Road intersection; and

**WHEREAS**, the current application request is \$1,500,00.00 to be put toward purchase of right of way and utility relocation; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Tontitown understands that Federal-aid Funds are available for this project on a reimbursable basis, requiring work to be accomplished and proof of payment prior to actual monetary reimbursement; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Tontitown understands that there will be no reimbursement for any work accomplished prior to issuance by the Arkansas Department of Transportation of an official notice to Proceed; and

**WHEREAS**, this project, using federal funding, will be open and available for use by the general public.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the City Council of the City of Tontitown, Arkansas:

**Section 1.** The City of Tontitown will participate in accordance with its designated responsibility.

**Section 2.** The Mayor of Tontitown is hereby authorized and directed to execute all appropriate agreements and contracts necessary to expedite the design and environmental work of the above stated project.

**Section 3.** The City Council of Tontitown pledges its full support and hereby authorizes the City of Tontitown to cooperate with the Northwest Arkansas Regional Planning Commission.
