2025 NOTABLE EVENTS

- Det. Lowe returned from training and quickly put together operations to stop sex offenders during those operations the Tontitown Police Department arrested 13 individuals who were charged with Internet Stalking of a Child (note none of these individuals were Tontitown residence but attempted to commit a crime within the city limits).
- Tontitown Police Department continued with TIV training all full-time sworn officers have been certified in tactical vehicle intervention techniques.
- TPD FOP was able to help over 30 kids through Shop With A Cop (\$300 per kid)
- Tontitown Police Department completed another successful Tontitown Police Citizen Academy.
