



THE TONTITOWN MARKET

2026 Vendor Application & Market Guideline

Market Season:

The Tontitown Market operates from May 2 through October 10, 2026. The market is held on Saturdays at Harry Sbanotto Park, located at 235 E. Henri de Tonti Blvd in the heart of Tontitown. All vendors must comply with park rules and regulations. For questions regarding park policies, please contact Tontitown City Hall. Limited electricity is available. Access is not guaranteed and will be accommodated as space allows. Vendors needing electricity must indicate this on their application.

Vendor Eligibility:

Vendor applications are accepted on a rolling basis throughout the market season. All vendors must sell items they have grown, produced, or created themselves. The resale of commercially produced or purchased items is not permitted. All products must comply with Arkansas state and local laws, including Cottage Food and Farmers Market regulations. Vendors must list all products they intend to sell on their application. Selling unlisted items may result in removal from the market.

Vendor Fees:

The following vendor types are fee-free:

- Non-profit organizations with valid 501(c)(3) documentation
- Child vendors (ages 15 and younger)

All other vendors:

- Season Pass: \$25
- Day Pass: \$5

Payments are accepted by check or card only. Card transactions include a convenience fee. Cash payments are not accepted.

Child Vendor Policy:

Child vendors (15 and younger) must be physically present and actively participating at their booth during market hours. If a booth is registered as a child vendor and the child is not present and participating, the booth will be required to pay standard vendor fees.

Pets:

Pets are welcome at the market; however, vendors are not permitted to sell animals. All pets must remain on a leash. Pet owners are responsible for their animals, including cleaning up after them and any damage caused. The City of Tontitown and Tontitown Market are not responsible for injury, loss, or damage related to pets.

Vendor Responsibilities

All vendors must:

- Follow Arkansas Department of Health and Farmers Market regulations
- Provide any required licenses, permits, or certifications
- Keep their booth and surrounding area clean
- Display the name of their business or booth
- Clearly display all accepted forms of payment
- Maintain a family-friendly environment (no offensive, illegal, or inappropriate displays)

The Market reserves the right to remove vendors who do not comply with these rules.

Setup & Communication:

After your application and payment are approved, a Market Coordinator will contact you regarding booth placement and setup details. Vendors should not assume booth placement without confirmation from the Market.
