7. **Comments from Citizens**

Kenneth Lovett- No address available.

- Mr. Lovett explains that he’s temporarily staying in Springdale until his rental in Tontitown is ready, but he’s still very worried about the air quality in Tontitown. He feels that something in the air was making him sick—headaches, coughing, trouble breathing—and says those symptoms went away after he moved. He admits he can’t prove the cause but believes it’s a real issue.

Mr. Lovett argues that city leadership delegates tasks, but sometimes to the wrong people, and that some individuals don’t follow through or act in the city’s best interest. He mentions past efforts by an air-quality committee that stopped after he was removed, and he believes the sewer issues are connected to the landfill. He asks who is going to take responsibility and fix these problems, saying that the city needs better follow-up and accountability.

Mark Calcagni 12642 Arbor Acres Rd., Tontitown, AR (The mayor read a email he submitted)

- Mr. Calcagni supports the proposed user fee for vehicles dumping at the landfill, noting that landfill truck traffic damages local roads. However, he is concerned that Waste Management might interpret the fee as Tontitown accepting or supporting the landfill. He emphasizes that the city has repeatedly opposed landfill expansion and has hosted the landfill for over 45 years, and he believes it’s time for another community to take on that burden.

Mr. Calcagni urges the city to include wording in the resolution stating that the fee does not signal acceptance of the landfill but is simply meant to recover costs caused by landfill-related traffic. He argues that scientific evidence shows landfills harm air, water, and the environment, and that Tontitown’s growth has outpaced the suitability of a rural landfill zone. He asks city leaders to prioritize health, safety, and infrastructure as the area continues to grow.

Captain Bowen of the Tontitown Police Department

- Captain Bowen read a formal commendation recognizing two police officers , Lound and Covington for exceptional professionalism, restraint, and life-saving actions in two separate incidents. In the first case, the officers entered a home, rescued an unresponsive person from a running vehicle in a closed garage, and kept her safe until medical help arrived. In the second case, they responded to an armed, intoxicated military veteran in a mental-health crisis who expressed a desire to die. The officers de-escalated the situation without violence, preventing what could have become a fatal encounter.

Captain Bowen emphasizes that although the Police Department often receives criticism, these officers exemplify its core values—pride, professionalism, and proactive policing. He praises their courage, compassion, and discipline, and presents them with life-saving awards for their service and commitment to the community.
